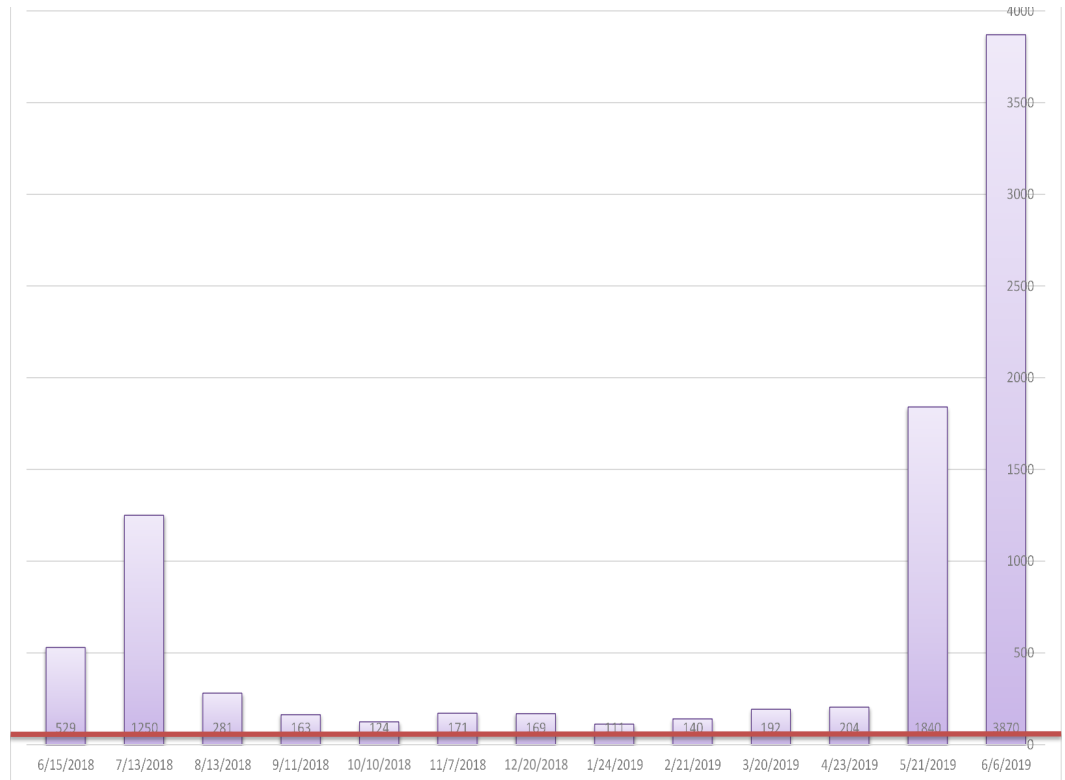




# Sand Point Spit Beach PSP Results

The Response to Paralytic Shellfish Poisoning in Aleut Communities project is funded by the Region 10 U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and managed by the Qagan Tayagungin Tribe with the Indian General Assistance Program (IGAP). Samples are analyzed by the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation's Environmental Health Laboratory using approved analytical methods. Data collection will continue through September 2020. Note, the FDA limit for PSP is 80 micrograms/100 grams, the red line on the graph. More information is available on our website at
