Qagan Tayagungin Tribe ARPA Relief Program

The purpose of this application is to provide immediate relief to the Qagan Tayagungin Tribal Citizens who have been directly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. If you are a Qagan Tayagungin Tribe Citizen as of **November 18, 2022** and have been directly affected, you are eligible for \$1,500 in relief due to the COVID-19 pandemic. **The application deadline is December 30, 2022 by 4:30 PM AKST.** Please fill out the following information to the best of your abilities.

Eligible Expenses: Applicant understands and agrees that any funds received through this program may only be used for eligible expenses which are necessary due to the COVID-19 pandemic incurred starting March 3, 2021 and are not being reimbursed by other Federal Government programs. The following is a general, non-exhaustive list of eligible expenses:

- Unreimbursed medical expenses related to COVID-19
- Groceries for food security during pandemic, including food shipping/delivery costs
- Payment of rent or mortgage (to avoid eviction or foreclosure, etc.)
- Utility costs such as electricity, gas, propane, water, firewood, internet, phone, etc.
- Other necessary expenses as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Starting on March 3, 2021, I have incurred necessary expenses and/or experienced the following due to the COVID-19 pandemic (check all that apply):

Taxation: Qagan Tayagungin Tribe is not treating these payments as taxable income. Consult with your own attorney or tax advisor for guidance.

Federal law governing fraud: “Whoever, in any matter within the jurisdiction of any department or agency of the United States, knowingly and willfully falsifies, conceals, or covers up by any trick or scheme or device, a material fact, or makes any false fictitious or fraudulent statements or representations or makes or uses any false writing on documents, knowing the same to contain any false, fictitious or fraudulent statement or entry, shall be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned not more than 5 years or both.” Submitting false applications constitutes conspiracy to defraud the United States Treasury and provides for a sentence no greater than 10 years in prison, three years of supervised release, and a fine of \$250,000 or twice the gross gain or loss, whichever is greater. The charge of wire fraud provides for a sentence of no greater than 20 years in prison, three years of supervised release, and a fine of \$250,000 or twice the gross gain or loss, whichever is greater. In the event the federal government fails to prosecute, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribe may consider prosecution.

Noncustodial parents who attempt to defraud the Qagan Tayagungin Tribe, by applying on behalf of children not under their legal custody, will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

By signing this application, I certify under penalty of perjury and false swearing that my answers are correct and complete to the best of my knowledge. I understand that receiving this grant may affect my eligibility to receive other COVID-19 related financial assistance. I understand that it is the sole responsibility of the applicant to determine or seek independent advice as to the tax implications of receiving American Rescue Plan grant funds. I have read and understand the questions and statements on this application.
