**RESOLUTION 01-02**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE QAGAN TAYAGUNGIN TRIBE AUTHORIZING THE ALEUTIAN PRIBILOF ISLANDS ASSOCIATION, INC. (APIA), TO SUBMIT APPLICATIONS ON BEHALF OF AUTHORIZING MEMBER VILLAGES FOR THE TEA-21 INDIAN RESERVATION ROADS PLANNING FUNDS AS ANNOUNCED IN THE FEDERAL REGISTER NOTICE OF JANUARY 9, 2001..**

WHEREAS, The Qagan Tayagungin Tribe of Sand Point is a sovereign federally recognized tribe with government to government status with the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, the Aleutian/ Pribilof Islands Association, Inc. (APIA) is a regional tribal organization made up of the member federally recognized tribes in the Aleutian/ Pribilof / Shumagin Island Region of Alaska with a mission to provide a broad range of social, health, human and community services to the tribes and tribal members of the region; and

WHEREAS, the APIA Region has a need for transportation infrastructure development and would greatly benefit economically and socially from such improved infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, under the Federal Register notice of January 9, 2001, each member tribe is eligible to apply for a planning grant of up to \$35,000 to conduct comprehensive tribal transportation planning; and

WHEREAS, the development of a joint, cooperative village – APIA transportation planning program would be in the long term best interests of each individual member tribe and their respective members; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that APIA is authorized to apply for IRR Transportation Planning funds on behalf of all member authorizing tribes and administer such funds through the existing APIA D.O.I. Self-Governance Compact Annual Funding Agreement and individual village MOA's and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if successful in securing the planning funds, APIA will work in close consultation with each authorizing member village to design a transportation planning program that best meets the long term need of each tribe and maximizes the opportunities for accessing IRR transportation construction project funding; and that promotes maximum economic opportunities and infrastructure development at the local level.
