A resolution of the Qagan Tayagungin Tribe to support Eastern Aleutian Tribes, Inc. applying for a Office of Violence Against Women, Indian Tribal Governments Program grant for the purpose of addressing domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking in the Eastern Aleutians. This project will aid Eastern Aleutian Tribes in developing and strengthening programs to deal with violent crimes against women and children, including the crimes of sexual assault, domestic violence and the sexual abuse of minors.

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribal Council of Sand Point is a sovereign federally recognized tribe with government-to-government status with in the United States of America; and,

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribal Council consists of an active seven-member governing body of the Qagan Tayagungin tribe of Sand Point; and,

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribal Council has the right to contract for and provide certain Federal and State programs and services on behalf of tribal members of the Native Community of Sand Point; and,

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribe is a Consortia member of the Eastern Aleutian Tribes, Inc. for the primary purpose of improving the health of all of the people of the Eastern Aleutians; and,

WHEREAS, the Tribe continues to promote the development of local capacities to effectively support programs to deal with violent crimes against women and children; and,

WHEREAS, the Tribe endeavors to provide effective outreach and programming for domestic violence and sexual assault issues identified by the Qagan Tayagungin Tribal Council, and Community of Sand Point in conjunction with other community supporting agencies, including Eastern Aleutian Tribes, Inc. ; and,

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribal Council, and Community of Sand Point in conjunction with other community supporting agencies, including Eastern Aleutian Tribes, Inc. have used identified issues to recommend a plan(s) of action and will continue to reevaluate and develop domestic violence and sexual assault focus groups; and,
