Resolutions 91-04

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Council is an Alaska Native village traditionally organized and recognized by the United States through the Secretary of Interior; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Council is the governing body for the Sand Point Natives; and.

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Council met with its tribal members to set priorities on May 13, 1992; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Members determined the most pressing need is to strengthen the Tribal Government and to do a master plan for Economic and Social development; and

WHEREAS, only minimal resources are available to the Qagan Tayagungin Council to pursue our goals; and

WHEREAS, the Administration for Native Americans is a source of support and financial assistance to the Qagan Tayagungin Council to help us achieve our goals;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Qagan Tayagungin Council asks, by way of proposal that is being submitted to the Administration for Native Americans, for federal assistance in achieving its goals of governance, economic and social improvement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Qagan Tayagungin Council asks the Administration for Native Americans for a careful review of our proposal and decision to award a "SEDS" grant to the Council in order to assist us in achieving our goals.
