

RESOLUTION 93-04

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin is an Alaska Native village traditionally organized and recognized by the United States through the Secretary of Interior; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Council is the governing body for the Sand Point Natives; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Council met to set priorities on May 13, 1992; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Council determined the most pressing need is to strengthen the Tribal Government; and

WHEREAS, only minimal resources are available to the Qagan Tayagungin Council to pursue our goals; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is a source of support and financial assistance to the Qagan Tayagungin Council to help us achieve our goals;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Qagan Tayagungin Council asks, by way of proposal that is being submitted to the Bureau of Indian Affairs, for federal assistance in achieving its goals of governance to improve self-determination in the operation of programs designed to benefit our native people.

PASSED and APPROVED by a duly constituted quorum of the Qagan Tayagungin Council this 15th day of January, 1993.
