**WHEREAS,** the Qagan Tayagungin is an Alaska Native village traditionally organized and recognized by the United States through the Secretary of Interior; and

**WHEREAS,** the Qagan Tayagungin Council is the governing body for the Sand Point Natives; and

**WHEREAS,** the Qagan Tayagungin Council adopted its goals on January 17, 1994; and

**WHEREAS,** the Qagan Tayagungin Council determined the preservation of the Aleut culture and traditions is very important; and

**WHEREAS,** only minimal resources are available to the Qagan Tayagungin Council to pursue our goals; and

**WHEREAS,** there are few Aleut Elders in our Community to teach us; and

**WHEREAS,** the National Park Service is a source of support and financial assistance to the Qagan Tayagungin Council to help us achieve our goals;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Qagan Tayagungin Council asks, by way of proposal that is being submitted to the National Park Service, for assistance in achieving its goals of preserving the Aleut culture and traditions for our native people.
