

RESOLUTION #94-003

Bureau of Indian Affairs
Small Tribes Grant Program

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin is an Alaska Native Village traditionally organized and recognized by the United States through the Secretary of Interior; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Council is the governing body for the Village of Sand Point; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribe has an active tribal government with an enrollment of 651 members; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribal Council lack financial resources to meet its core administrative or management needs; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribe is requesting funds from Bureau of Indian Affairs, Small Tribe Grant Program, development component; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribe is committed to incorporating and maintaining the positive results expected from the grant and to maintain sound management systems; and

WHEREAS, no elected official will receive a salary or any other form of compensation from the Small Tribes Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the Qagan Tayagungin Tribal Council agrees to submit the quarterly financial status and progress reports; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Qagan Tayagungin Council asks, by way of proposal that is being submitted to Bureau of Indian Affairs, for assistance in financial resources to meet its core administrative and management needs.
