Rights of Parties

As per the Qagan Tayagungin Tribe's Judicial Code, Chapter 2, Section 3, parties appearing before the Qagan Tayagungin Tribal Court have rights as specified by the Indian Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended. Parties appearing before the Court shall have the following rights, which include and exceed those of the Indian Civil Rights Act:

- Parties shall have the right to be notified of court hearing, except in cases of emergency circumstances when a party is not reasonably available to be notified
- Right to copies of documents submitted to the court and court generated documents
- Opportunity to be heard
- Opportunity to present witnesses and evidence
- Opportunity to question any witnesses
- Right to a fair hearing
- Right to request a Change of Order if new evidence or circumstances change in the case
- Right to appeal the final decision to the Qagan Tayagungin Appellate Court.

Parties are also entitled to have an advocate at the hearing. An advocate may be any other person that a party wishes to have advise him or her. Unless otherwise allowed by the Court, the advocate will not be permitted to address the Court or other parties directly. Advocates participation will be limited to asking questions of the client and consulting with the client.
